

# Recent cases

Sophie Perry

---

## G v J

The claimant, who was 63 at the time of the accident was travelling home when the defendant pulled from a side road and pushed the claimant into the path of an oncoming vehicle causing airbags to deploy upon impact. As a result he sustained extensive soft tissue injuries and a fracture to the ulnar aspect of the index finger.

Following multiple investigations I was able to establish that the accident had caused degenerative changes to be accelerated by the accident.

I facilitated rehabilitation to help alleviate the soft tissue damage which resulted in the claimant returning to his pre accident level so that he could continue to enjoy his retirement with his wife and family.

## M v F

The claimant, a 50 year old doctor was travelling home from a weekend away when the defendant, who was under the influence of alcohol collided head on with the claimant's vehicle. The defendant fled the scene of the accident.

The claimant sustained a fracture to the collar bone along with a dislocated shoulder and extensive soft tissue damage.

Following my appointment I was able to arrange extensive rehabilitation to assist the client in recovering from his injuries.

The case continues.

## P v N

The claimant was involved in a road traffic accident on the motorway. The defendant had changed lanes colliding with the claimant's vehicle and subsequently causing her vehicle to spin and collide with other vehicles in the fast lane and ultimately come to rest at the central reservation.

The claimant sustained multiple soft tissue injuries but continues to suffer with significant psychological trauma including anxiety, flashbacks and avoidance of driving.

An early admission of liability has been secured enabling me to obtain expert opinion from orthopaedic and psychological experts and facilitate early access to physiotherapy for physical symptoms and cognitive behavioural therapy (CBT) along with eye movement desensitisation and reprocessing (EMDR) therapy to help relieve the claimant's psychological stress.
